



## “Back to Learning ” project

### ➤ Who Are We?

Abjad initiative for education has been established in 2018 as an independent, civic and non-profit learning initiative by a group of people with different backgrounds and specializations aiming to provide the opportunity of quality education for children and youth in need within Syria and the neighboring countries. In Abjad, with our 60 volunteers, we aim to connect the Syrian youth and provide them with the opportunity of developing and sharing their skills and expertise within a unique, social and educational framework.

#### ○ Our achievements

Abjad has provided more than **9,100** learning hours for more than **780** students aged between 8 and 13 years in different subjects, through accelerated learning and assistant programs.

In addition, Abjad provided more than **37** training programs in specific specialties and in different areas of management to enhance the skills of the teachers and college students through the “Athar” capacity-building program.

### ➤ “Back to Learning” Project

This project comes to continue what has been started by Abjad initiative since 2018. It aims to provide primary education to 500 children who have dropped out of school for years in the Northern Syrian camps by providing specialized learning programs and bring them back to school to the grade of their age by 2022.

#### ○ Why “Back to Learning”?

With more than 3 million IDPs “Internally displaced people” in the Northern Syrian camps, most of the children born and living in these camps have been deprived of proper education with its social and psychological dimensions. Therefore, this Project provides educational, social, and psychological support to those children.

#### ○ Information about the Project:




#### Project goals:

- Provide education for 500 children who have lost their education completely due to the continuous displacement and war in the age group between 8-12 years.
- Enhance the sense of community and adaptation for the displaced people in the camps.
- Develop the capacity of the teaching staff through specialized training programmes.
- Improve the economic wellbeing of the teaching staff to enable them to stay in these communities and give back to them.


○ Let's continue together:
